A REFLECTION FROM OUR EXECUTIVE PRESBYTER, WENDY TAJIMA

Reflection

For as the new heavens and the new earth, which I will make, shall remain before me, says the Lord, so shall your descendants and your name remain. From new moon to new moon, and from sabbath to sabbath, all flesh shall come to worship before me, says the Lord.

Isaiah 66:22-23

Happy New Year!

As some of you know, New Year's Day is a big deal for Japanese. This makes for a fascinating mix of traditions for the sizable Japanese-American community in Pasadena. I remember my younger days with many of us working on Rose Parade floats, sleeping on the street, watching the parade, then going to my aunt's house for a day-long feast of food, family, and football.

I no longer work on the floats or sleep on the parade route, and the New Year's event has moved to my cousin's house. As my mother's generation has passed on, the table is now filled with a broader mix of foods, as more and more diverse folk contribute to the table. Mixed in with the Japanese food this year was our version of Korean beef (I now realize it would be unrecognizable as meat jun), a ham and cheese board, and spanokopita. But it's all good, and the feeling that you are starting the new year with an abundance of love and resources is now shared with those who are not Japanese but appreciate the food and the fun.

It's still ingrained in me that how you start the new year sets the tone for the whole year. So I like New Year's Eve services, though I haven't attended many. I do try to bring in the new year with scripture and prayer; this passage from Isaiah was my focus as the clock struck midnight.

The passage reminds me how we measure the constancy of God through our sense of time. And with the dawn of each new year, we seek to put the bad behind us and start anew. Many of us make New Year's resolutions, committing ourselves to improve ourselves for the new year. I've been thinking about taking a stronger focus on health; while I've been trying to will myself into more exercise, this past week (when I slept far more than expected) makes me think I should get better sleep habits, and find more balance in my life. I'm also wanting to resolve to be more kind in my responses to people-though my sharp tongue seems to speak without my thinking, and sometimes kindness requires one to say the difficult thing that others don't want to say.

Forgive me for being so personal. While I do believe we should focus on our communal life as the body of Christ for our neighborhood, each of us as members of that body have individual feelings, challenges, and roles. I hope we can take the time to share these with each other.

I also hope that we see how God offers us every opportunity to start anew, not only when we turn the calendar but whenever we open up to God with repentance. With fresh new mercies every morning, every time we confess our sins, every time we go to Christ's table, every moment we seek God's grace, we take a step towards the new heavens and earth. May we encourage each other on the path, and share the good news of hope and promise in Jesus Christ with all we meet. There are already several ways we can do this in January, from closing out 2017 to gauging needs of the homeless to empowering ourselves through training at WinterFest. Read on for more information.

Homeless Count 2018: Getting Resources for the Homeless

Los Angeles has more chronically homeless, homeless veterans, and homeless young people than any other city in the country. Seventy-five percent of all homeless people in Los Angeles are living on the streets, in their cars, or in other makeshift situations, the second-highest rate of in the country. While homelessness is a big problem, we don't have to accept it as an unsolvable problem.

The Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count and the Pasadena Homeless Count are each an on-the-ground census of our homeless neighbors in need of support. These Homeless Counts occurs every year and the data collected is essential for advocating for and allocating resources where they will serve the greatest needs.

The Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count: January 23-25, 2018

There are various ways to volunteer. Training and all equipment and materials needed are provided. The time commitment on the night of the Count is usually 3-5 hours. Donations of refreshments and other in-kind donations at deployment sites are also being sought.


