OUR SPEAKERS-

DR. P. WILLARD OLSON

P. Willard Olson was born and raised in the Midwest. He spent just under a decade collecting degrees from UCLA while John Wooden was the basketball coach. He is trained as a plasma physicist. The first half of his career was spent working in research on the orbital space environment and the effects it has on both satellites and on humans. The second half was spent in general management in aerospace. He has participated in the many changes that have occurred in science and technology over the past several decades. Science now has a dramatically different story to tell than it did in the mid 20th century. He refutes the old claim that the cosmos is all there is.

DR. JOHN COBB JR.

John B. Cobb Jr. was born in Japan of Methodist missionary parents. He studied in Chicago on the GI bill, where he was taught the new naturalism that has shaped much of his career. This affirms that because we know that human beings are part of nature, nature is not the materialistic mechanism that science had taught and human beings are not the immaterial minds that humanists had posited. As a "process" theologian he believes that a science that includes and learns from the human soul and a theology that recognizes the deeply physical character of human life can complement and enrich each other.
