A MESSAGE FROM OUR MISSION ADVOCATE, WENDY GIST

I give you a newcommandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. John 13:34

God calls us to love one another, and while sometimes this commandment leads us to do good things **for** others, at other times it leads us to do good things in partnership **with** others. This is a constant issue we struggle with in the broad area of mission - doing for or doing with. While I believe that there is a place and actually a need for both, I tend to gravitate toward opportunities that would fall under the "doing with" heading as that can lead to empowerment and self-sufficiency of the individuals or groups we are working alongside.

The Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People (SDOP) is a perfect example of an empowerment model. SDOP makes it possible for us to financially support the programs or projects of disadvantaged communities through grants. This may sound very familiar - grants for programs or projects in disadvantaged communities. But, SDOP grants come with criteria unlike most other grant programs we may be familiar with. First, the project must be presented, owned, and controlled by the group of disadvantaged people who will benefit from it. This first criteria makes it impossible for the project to be one where some group is "doing for" others. Second, the project needs to address a long-term correction of conditions that keep people bound by poverty and oppression. This second criteria leads directly toward empowerment and self-sufficiency of oppressed people. There are other criteria that include being sensitive to the environment; not advocating violence; and describing, in detail, goals, objectives, the roles of direct beneficiaries, and the methods used to achieve goals and objectives. However, the first two criteria are what set SDOP apart and make it harder to find grant recipients sometimes.

The churches in our Presbytery have lots of good programs and connections to organizations with good programs that help poor, oppressed, and marginalized people in our communities in a myriad of ways. We are very good at "doing for" others and know of lots of organizations that run on that model. However, are you aware of groups in your community that are working to lift themselves out of poverty and oppression and make their own lives better? I would encourage all of us to open our eyes and ears and search out the groups of disadvantaged people in our area that are working to empower themselves. They are both exciting and inspiring!

As a reminder, our Presbytery is part of a joint SDOP Committee with the Presbytery of San Fernando. This committee has grant money available every year to support the work of groups that meet the SDOP criteria. Purpose: To further the mission of Jesus Christ through the Presbytery of San Gabriel by managing the office operations of the Presbytery, and maintaining records and processes in support of the Office of the Stated Clerk.

Responsibilities:

Along with Presbytery staff, strive to promote harmony and effective ministry of member churches and

 Presbytery leaders by responding to inquiries in a prompt and friendly manner.

- Manage an efficient and helpful office (including maintaining office hours, managing equipment and records, ordering supplies, managing paper workflow), utilizing technology and volunteers as appropriate to ensure timely and helpful responsiveness to Presbytery members and churches.
- Primary coordinator of communications for the Presbytery, including phone, mail, meeting calendar and reminders, and supervision of website.
- Provide property management support for Presbytery Center and other Presbytery properties, including management of vendors, documentation, and Facility Use Calendar.
- Act as recording clerk for meetings of the Presbytery, Presbytery Executive Commission, and Commissions of Ministry and Preparation for Ministry by taking minutes, managing documentation and scheduling of visitors, and supporting development of the dockets.
- Provide support to the Presbytery Stated Clerk by processing reports to individuals and other councils and agencies of the church regarding ecclesiastical status, and support for collection of annual ministry reports, annual statistical reports, and review of session minutes and records.
- Maintain the records of the Presbytery, including database, rolls and minutes, and physical files, including historical records of former congregations.
- Provide administrative help to Executive Presbyter, Bookkeeper, and Presbytery leaders as time allows.

Accountability: Works with both the Stated Clerk and Executive Presbyter as a colleague and support for their respective responsibilities. Annual reviews will be conducted by the Executive Presbyter with input from the Stated Clerk, and reviewed by the Personnel Committee.

During our Presbytery Service Day in June 40 school kits were assembled thanks to all your donations. Kristi Van Nostran, our Immigrant Accompaniment Organizer, retained 10 school kits for the students she is connected with that are being hosted in our area. The other 30 kits and the remainder of the school supplies were donated to the San Fernando Valley Refugee Children Center (SFVRCC) which is currently serving over 200 unaccompanied minors. Our Presbytery has been connecting with and supporting the SFVRCC since 2016 when we collected food and donated it to them for Thanksgiving baskets at our November 2016 Presbytery meeting.

Wendy Gist, our Mission Advocate, took the school kits and supplies to the SFVRCC just before they held their annual Back to School event for the children they work with. The SFVRCC staff was very appreciative and send their thanks to everyone in San Gabriel Presbytery for the ongoing support of their ministry serving unaccompanied minors.

Boundary Training Offered in Multiple Languages

The Synod of Southern California and Hawaii has arranged with Dr. Kibbie Ruth to hold several trainings to prevent sexual harassment and misconduct. The Commission on Ministry of San Gabriel Presbytery is requiring that any new pastor, or any pastor who for whatever reason has not been to a recent training, attend one of these trainings. In addition, the morning session of each day is designed to satisfy the new sexual harassment prevention training requirement of the State of California for all employers with five or more employees (this includes churches with staff of five or more).

The training is \$10 for the morning or \$15 for the whole day (including lunch), and you have the choice of three days and locations. Each training will begin at 9 am and end by 3 pm.


